

COURSE OBJECTIVE

This training covers the requirements of international convention STCW 1978 as amended and Code (Manila amendments 2010) Chapter VI, Section A/VI-1-2 and Malaysian requirements set out by the Director of Marine Malaysia Merchant Shipping (Training and Certification) on meeting the minimum standard of competence in :

- Table A-VI/1-1 Personal Survival Techniques
- Table A-VI/1-2 Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting
- Table A-VI/1-3 Elementary First Aids
- Table A-VI/1-4 Personal Safety and Social Responsibilities

LEARNING OUTCOMES

To successfully complete this training delegates must competence included knowledge, understanding, proficiency and demonstrating as the following:

- 1) Survive at sea in the event of ship abandonment.
- 2) Minimize the risk of fire and maintain a state of readiness to respond to emergency situations involving fire.
- 3) Fight and extinguish fires.
- 4) Take immediate action upon encountering an accident or other medical emergency.
- 5) Comply with emergency procedures.
- 6) Take precautions to prevent pollution of the marine environment.
- 7) Observe safe working practices.
- 8) Contribute to effective communications on board ship.
- 9) Contribute to effective relationships on board ship.
- 10) Understand and take necessary actions to control fatigue

PREREQUISITES

All delegates must be in possession of a valid document/certificate issued and approved by Marine Department of Malaysia as listed:

- Valid seafarer medical certificate issued by an approved medical practitioner;
- Valid seaman card/identity document; AND
- Be not less than 18 years of age.

TARGET GROUP

This course is suitable for seafarers employed or engaged in any capacity on-board ship, in accordance with STCW Manila Code reference Section A/VI-1-2

DURATION

6 days

VALIDITY

Upon successful completion and assessment, a certificate of proficiency may be issued in accordance with STCW A/VI-12 by the Marine Department of Malaysia.

Validity is for 5 years.
